

## **Core Clinical Clerkships: Psychiatry**

At the end of the Psychiatry Clerkship, the student should be able to:

- 1) Recognize the clinical presentation of the major psychiatric disorders.
- 2) Know the diagnostic criteria and effective interventions for psychiatric conditions frequently seen in medical practice.
- 3) Perform an appropriate mental status exam and clinical interview with a psychiatrically complex patient.
- 4) Write the results of a comprehensive psychiatric history and evaluation.
- 5) Orally present a clear and complete psychiatric evaluation.
- 6) Work in a multidisciplinary team with good, professional interactions.
- 7) Design an appropriate treatment plan, which reflects awareness of the patient, family and community resources, as well as knowledge of behavioral and psychopharmacological interventions.
- 8) Describe the legal and ethical issues raised by psychiatric conditions in both general medical and psychiatric settings.
